FUNERAL OF PIONEER IS HELD AT MARX PARLORS

At 10 o'clock yesterday morning the funeral of Luke B. McMurry, one of the pioneers of this section, who died on Wednesday atternoon at 5 o'clock at the home of Mrs. Watson Bloom, southwest of Tumwater, was held at the Marx & Son undertaking parlors, the Rev. R. Hopkins-of Tumwater officiating.

The deceased was born in Kentucky in 1825, and with his parents moved to Indiana while still a boy. Here he grew to manhood and then moved to Illinois, and then to Arkansas. He came from there to the Pacific coast thirty years ago, locating on Ward's lake, southeast of Olympia. He was an intimate ffiend of General John A. Logan, having known the latter when he was living in Southern Illinois. He is survived by two sons, A. W. Mc-Murray of Irma, Alberta, Canada: J. M. McMurry of Port Townsend, and a daughter, Mrs. J. C. Waddle of Olym. nia. Interment was made in the I. O. O. F. cemetery.
